Northamptonshire Archives holds a number of hospital records. The main historic ones are detailed below.

### NORTHAMPTON GENERAL HOSPITAL (INFIRMARY)

Northampton Infirmary was founded in 1743 and still operates from the same site.

### DUSTON WAR HOSPITAL

St Crispins Hospital, Northampton was converted to a War Hospital between 1915 and 1918.

### NORTHAMPTON ST. ANDREW'S HOSPITAL (pre 1876 county asylum)

Founded as the Northampton General Lunatic Asylum 1838. St. Andrew's still functions as a private mental hospital. It ceased to take pauper patients for the county 1876 when a new asylum at Berrywood opened, see Northampton St. Crispin.

The hospital maintains its own archive, which includes the main series of administrative and medical records. The records in the Northamptonshire Record Office are box listed only.
